What Hearts For Hospice Offers

SKILLED NURSING

- Assess the patient's physical needs
- Develop and coordinate a plan of care
- Ensure symptom control and management
- Provide continual patient/family education as needed

Certified Nursing Assistants

- Provide direct personal care to the patient
- Offer emotional support to the patient and family

Medical Social Workers

- Assess the patient's & family's emotional & social needs
- Develop a plan of care
- Provide counseling, referrals & support to meet identified needs

Bereavement Care

- Offer grief & bereavement counseling through individual & group programs prior to and after the patient's death.
- Maintain regular contact with the family for up to thirteen months after the death of the patient.

Music Therapy

- Music therapy is offered for the patient, as well as the caregiver and family.

LEVELS OF CARE

- Routine Home Care – Basic level of care provided under the hospice benefit.
- Inpatient Care – Short-term care provided at a hospital or other inpatient care center only until the patient's symptoms are under control.
- Respite Care – Temporary inpatient care provided up to five consecutive days to give the family a needed break.
- Continuous Care – More intense care provided by a nurse and/or home health aide in the patient's home environment for a minimum of 8 hours per day until symptoms are under control.

MEDICATIONS, MEDICAL EQUIPMENT & SUPPLIES PROVIDED:

- Durable Medical Equipment for the terminal disease condition
- Disease specific and pain medications
- Supplies such as personal care items

VOLUNTEER SERVICES

- Hearts for Hospice Volunteers receive comprehensive training by the Volunteer Coordinator.
- Volunteers are matched with the needs of the patient and family to address many different areas of opportunity for support.

Questions

Who is Hospice Care for?

Hospice care is available and appropriate for anyone who has made the decision—along with their families and doctors—to change their goals from curative to comfort.

Who is Qualified?

Assuming the disease process follows its normal course, any person certified by their attending physician to have a life expectancy of six months or less.

Will There be a Need for a New Physician?

In addition to the support of the Hospice Medical Director, the patient can, if they choose, continue to see their Primary Care Physician.

Where is Hospice Provided?

Hospice provides services that promote the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of the patient and family in the patient's home, or wherever the patient resides.

How is Hospice Paid for?

Hearts for Hospice accepts the Medicare and Medicaid Hospice Benefit. In addition, we work with each patient to maximize the value of whatever Private Insurance is in place.
